

Ideas for Chatter Boards

Number recognition

Write the numbers that you want the children to focus on, onto the board – not in order. Record yourself saying the numbers for each one.

Children say the number and then press it. The voice will then say the number. Were children correct?

Any numbers can be used.
EYFS – focus on numbers to 10.
KS1- extend with numbers to 20, 50 or 100



Letter recognition - lowercase

Write the letters that you want the children to focus on, onto the board – not in order. Record yourself saying the numbers for each one.

Children say the letter and then press it. The voice will then say the letter. Were children correct?

This can be used alongside phonics. The different sound written onto the board for the children to identify.



Ideas for Chatter Boards

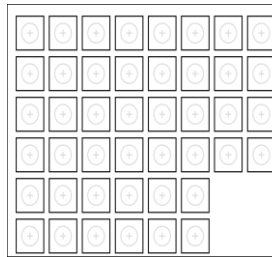
Letter recognition- Capital Letter (KS1)

Write the letters (lowercase) in order onto the grid squares. Record yourself saying the letter name for each one.

Children have a pile of uppercase letters. They choose one and then try to find the matching lowercase letter on the grid.



TTS Chatter Boards are made of 44 blank, dry-wipe tiles, each of which can be recorded on individually for up to 10 seconds.



Learning colours (EYFS)

The Chatter Board is ideal to help children learn colours. Have different colours on each square. Children press to hear what colour it is. Great to set up in the art area so that children can ask for the correct colours they want to use.



EAL ideas for Chatter Boards



- ❖ Model language and use to say and identify classroom objects (pencil, ruler, pen, etc...)
- ❖ Place around the school (classroom, hall, playground...)
- ❖ Enhance speech with actions they might need to carry out (drink of water, toilet...)
