“During British Science week the Easi- Scope was used to hook in the pupils and increase engagement. During assembly photos were used and pupils had to predict what they believed the object was. Then the image was zoomed out to allow the pupils to predict again. This had a positive impact across the school as they were eager for British Science week to begin.”

“During the Y5 topic of Materials pupils used the Easi- Scope to look at a range of material surfaces and predict if the surface had high or low friction. The pupils were more involved in the investigation and looked for the reasoning behind the relationship between the level friction and the material texture. Y5 pupils then

gained knowledge on how to use this device and supported Y1 pupils with their topic on materials, modelling high level vocabulary while discussing each image.”

“Used in UKS2 and KS1 for materials topics, looking at different materials under the scope.

KS2 children created their own version of the zoom in and zoom out activity for the ks1 children to try. They used it to work out what the materials were using their properties.
