**Singing with babies** – Give them lots of time to stick their tongue out and join in.

**Singing with toddlers** - Encourage toddlers to stick their tongue out, wiggle and waggle it and make funny noises!

**Older children** – Encourage them to act out the song by pretending to be a frog – dance, hop and jump!
