

Easi-Headphones: Ways to use

Enjoy a range of listening activities with the Easi-Headphones. Here are 12 different ways you could use the Easi-Headphones to support learning.

Independent Learning

Use the headphones to minimise distractions and noise and help pupils to concentrate and focus on what they are doing.

Comprehension

Play audiobooks, podcasts and recorded stories. You could set comprehension questions for the pupils to answer. Great for using during a group reading session, or silent reading time.

Reading Aloud

Listen to people reading aloud. Record reading aloud and listen back to it, focusing on pronunciation, fluency, expression and intonation.

News Broadcasts

Listen to news broadcasts and discuss. Children could take notes of the key facts and report back to the class on the information they have found.

Music Appreciation

Explore different genres of music. Learn about the musical instruments and sounds. Encourage the children to draw or paint while listening to the music. What does the music make them think of? Analyse lyrics and learn the words to different songs.

Creative Thinking and Inspiring Writing

Use sound stimuli to inspire writing and help to create ideas. Great for supporting creative writing and thinking of words to use in poetry.

Listen to Podcasts

Listen to podcasts and analyse the content. Then use these ideas to create your own podcasts.

Research

Listen to information on a specific topic/area and take notes. Research a topic, find audiobooks or podcasts to listen to and record key facts you hear.

Sound Effects to Inspire

Use sound effects for different topics such as the rainforest. Use the sounds to inspire artwork and set the scene for activities. Improve listening skills by playing games such as 'What's that sound?'

Wellbeing

Play calming music or guided meditation tracks to help pupils to relax and refocus. Useful to give minds a break in a busy day.

Phonics and Pronunciation

Listen to phonics games, pronunciation exercises or to listen to someone speaking in another language. Pick-up individual sounds and hear accents clearly.
