

Interactive Word Wall

Display and record information to help children learn new vocabulary. Ideal for topic work as it allows children to build confidence using and understanding the correct terminology. Words can be added to the wall throughout the topic. A great tool for learning and recapping new words.

Science Wall Chart

The pockets can be used to show life cycles. Place pictures of the stages of life in the pockets and record descriptions of what happens at each stage onto the device. Seeing and hearing the information will help children to remember and understand.

Nature Detectives

Groups or individuals could use the Interactive Recordable Wall Chart to display items found on a nature walk. They could provide a short commentary of what they have discovered to share with others. Why not use the wall chart as an identification tool for spotting and naming trees, minibeasts, birds, etc.

Interactive Treasure Map

Use the chart as a grid (6x5) and create your own treasure map using the pockets. Grid references, clues or directions could be recorded to follow a route on the map, to find specific features and discover where the treasure is hidden!

Interactive Maths Chart

Create a multiplication chart or number square to use to practise maths facts or use the chart to display shapes. You could make the chart into an interactive game, listening to a description of a shape or facts about a number and placing the shape or number that matches the description into the pockets.

Talking Phonics Wall

Hear and see the various phonemes and graphemes and create own matching game or string of rhyming words. Encourage children to listen to, make, explore and talk about sounds. Used daily the children will become quicker at recognising the graphemes displayed and at hearing the phonemes to begin to build words.

Getting to Know Me

Each pupil can add a photo of themselves to a pocket on the chart and record 30 seconds of information about them. For example, their name, hobbies, pets, etc. They could each ask a question for the listener to answer to promote conversations and get everyone talking.

Wellbeing Activity Board

Behind each pocket display instructions for five-minute wellbeing activities to help individuals to stay calm and refocus. These could be breathing exercises, fun songs/ rhymes to sing, or yoga moves. Pictures could be used in the pockets to help pupils to select the activity they wish to do.

Learning Wall

Use the Interactive Recordable Wall Chart to show visual and auditory prompts to support children to become more independent. These could include instructions to help individuals to complete tasks. They can play back the instructions as many times as is necessary to understand what they have to do.

You can easily change the contents of the pockets and record new messages, making this an ideal multi-sensory chart suitable for many purposes.
